NOTICE REGARDING CERTAIN INSTRUCTION (EDUCATION CODE 51550)

Parents and guardians may request in writing that their child not attend a class in which human reproductive organs and their functions and processes are described, illustrated or discussed. (The law does not apply to descriptions or illustrations that may appear in a textbook, adopted pursuant to law, on physiology, biology, zoology, general science, personal hygiene, or health). Such topics are covered in an age appropriate manner in Whitney courses consistent with the state content standards and an academically rigorous curriculum. Parents may inspect textbooks, audiovisual aids, and any other instructional materials to be used in such classes. Parents may request in writing that their child not attend such a class. Any such request, valid for one school year, should be sent to the appropriate Grade Level Advisor.
